

iGiveTest v2 Documentation

User and Administrator Guide

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Technical Implementation and System Requirements

The iGiveTest system is developed in PHP 4 (PHP 5) programming language. The system depends on neither the operating system used on the Web-server, nor the type of server.

Only **PHP 4.1.2** or higher versions are needed along with any widespread tool for database management (**MySQL, PostgreSQL, MSSQL Server** or **Oracle**).

The system can be tested in the following operating systems:

- GNU/Linux (RedHat 6.x/7.x, Debian 2.x/3.x, Slackware 8.0, ...)
- Windows 95/98/NT/2000/XP
- Solaris 8.0
- FreeBSD 4.x

The system supports most of the database management tools:

- MySQL 3.22.32 and higher
- PostgreSQL 7.1.3 and higher
- MSSQL Server 2000 and higher
- Oracle 8 and higher

For managing and working with an iGiveTest website, a browser of any type can be used. If you want to use the additional features of the HTML editor, you will need **Internet Explorer 5.5** (or higher), **Firefox 1.0** (or higher), or **Mozilla 1.3** (or higher) to ensure proper work of the editor.

Take a Test Section

The testing module enables you to perform testing with the help of the “**Test Manager**”.

All tests assigned for a user logged in the system are presented in the form of a table.

1. Name of the test;
2. Description of the test;
3. Information about test's availability (available, the number of allowed attempts, the date since which the test becomes available, etc.)

To start testing, simply select a corresponding test from the list. The structure of the standard testing page looks as following:

1. Estimated time left for testing;
2. Current position of the test (the number of the current questions and the total number of the questions);
3. The name of the test or the name of the current section;
4. Question(s);
5. Navigation buttons.

When testing is finished, the page with the test results (if these are necessary) are displayed. The content of the page is defined by a user, according to the test settings (name of the test, date of the test, time spent on the testing, the grade in the chosen grading system, the number of correct answers, the number of received points, and other data).







In addition, after testing is finished, a user can send a letter with the test results via email, build a report or a certificate (including printable PDF format), and view the page with the detailed results of the test (“**Report manager**”).





Question Bank Section

The question bank allows you to create, edit, structure and gather statistics on all questions.

Creation/editing a question

This page enables one to create a new question or to edit an existing one.

If one selects «Multiple-choice», «Multiple-answer» or «True-False» as a question type, the page would look as following:

1. Select question type;
2. Select a subject, to which the question refers;
3. Select a number of answers. If the number of answers on the page (the default value is five answers) is enough for you, then you can ignore this field;
4. HTML-editor for entering the text of a question. A question can contain any formatted text, graphical object, animation, audio and video;
5. Text of one of the answer variants;
6. The checkbox for selecting whether the answer is correct or not;
7. Fine adjustment of answers, which allows to specify how accurate the answer is (how many per cents of total rate will be given in case the specific variant is chosen);
8. The feedback text to be displayed when the specified answer is chosen;
9. Number of points given for answering the question.

If the question type is “**Short answer**,” the page will remain the same, with the only difference that in the field for entering the text of answer variant ([5]), you should enter exactly what a user taking the test should type as a correct answer.

If there is more than one correct answer variant, then simply set the number of variants ([3]), and then specify the texts of each variant in a separate question type ([5]).

Since the questions of the “**Essay**” type usually does not provide for a precise list of exact correct answers and evaluation is performed manually after the test is done, the page does not contain fields for entering correct answers:

The question of the “**Random question**” type is actually a directive to insert an arbitrary (new for each new testing) question on specified subject ([2]).

10. The name of a question. It is displayed in Question Bank and Test Manager instead of question text. It serves as a note for a test compiler.












Thus, for example, if you have a set of questions, from which you want to arbitrarily select 3 questions, you must simply:

- 1) Make sure that one and the same subject is selected on all question editing pages of the set (i.e. all questions should be combined into one subject);
- 2) Create the question of “Random question” type, and select a subject in the list;
- 3) Add the received random question to the test as many times as it is necessary (in this case, 3 times).

The “**Subjects**” section allows one to create and edit question subjects.

1. The flag, which controls the test's activity (availability);
2. Select a subject of the test's main question;
3. Link to creation and editing of subjects;
4. The name of the test;
5. Short description of the test, which a user can view on the "Start testing" page together with the name of the test;
6. The editor for entering the test instructions, which are displayed before beginning the test;
7. Select the date from which the test will be available to a user;
